
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A Prayer To Baba...

"Blessed are they who can spare a few moments to commune with the Lord before starting the day. Pray to Him from the core of your heart.

O Adorable Lord of mercy and love,

Salutations and prostrations unto Thee.

Thou art Omnipotent, Omniscient, Omnipresent.

Thou art Soul of my soul, life of my life.

Grant us an understanding heart, equal vision, balanced mind, faith, devotion and wisdom.

To resist temptations and control the mind, free us from egoism, lust, greed and jealousy.

Fill our hearts with Divine virtues.

Bless me O Lord! to be truthful in thought, word and deed.

Bless me O Master Supreme! to become Thy fit instrument to fulfil Thine own will.

Bless me O Lord! to serve Thee in all these names and forms.

I am Thy child, my Lord!

guide me, protect me, save me."

Imagery of the Good Shepherd in the Spiritual Domain : A Contemplative Glance At Jesus Christ, Lord Krishna and Shirdi Sai Baba

Dear Sai devotees! This article is a humble offering at the Feet of the *Sadguru* Sai Nath, Who walks beside us in every age and every form - be it as the gentle Shepherd of Galilee, the divine Cowherd of *Vrindavan* or the compassionate *Fakir* of Shirdi. My reflections are born of a lifetime of spiritual yearning, daily recitation and the grace-filled moments where the Divine reveals itself - not through thunder or spectacle, but through a whisper, a glance, a presence that never leaves.


The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one of the most tender and powerful metaphors in Christian scripture. In John 10:11, Jesus declares : "I am the Good Shepherd..."

In the sacred Gospel of John, Jesus continues :

"The Good Shepherd lays down his life

for the sheep... I know my own, and my own know me... and, there shall be one flock, one shepherd." This profound statement, rich in compassion and divine commitment, finds beautiful resonance in the Indian devotional (*bhakti*) tradition.

Across the unfolding epochs of human history, the Divine has walked among us, revealing itself in the tender guise of the shepherd - ever guiding, guarding and gathering the wandering soul. In the twilight of the *Dwāpar Yug*, more than three millennia before the Common Era, Lord Krishna, the Cowherd of Vrindavan, charmed creation with His flute, and illumined the battlefield of *Kurukshetra* with the immortal wisdom of the Bhagvad Geeta. Centuries later, upon the hillsides of Galilee in the first century of our era, Jesus Christ declared Himself the Good Shepherd, laying down His life in boundless love for His flock. And, in the nineteenth century, in the humble lanes of Shirdi, Sai Baba, clad in a torn *kafni*, became the Universal *Fakir*, calling His children to






of divine compassion and selfless service. They each assumed the role of the 'Good Shepherd', guiding and nurturing their followers with a profound sense of care and unconditional love. While their lives unfolded in distinct times and places, the essence of their mission remains strikingly similar, transcending cultural and geographical boundaries.

Lord Krishna, the Divine Incarnation of Vishnu, is revered in the lush, pastoral


faith and patience. Though separated by vast distances of time and culture, these three stand together in eternal kinship, embodiments of the Shepherd Spirit that transcends all frontiers, and leads humanity towards its divine pasture.

In the sacred tapestry of world religions, the figures of Lord Krishna, Jesus Christ and Shirdi Sai Baba stand as embodiments





surroundings of Vrindavan, where He spent His early years as the cowherd boy. He



is perhaps the most tender image of the shepherd in Indian tradition. ‘Gopal’ means ‘protector of cows’, but it also means the one who nurtures and guards the innocent souls. Like Jesus, Krishna knows each soul intimately, calls them by name through His flute, and draws them into divine play (*leela*). The *Bhagavat Puran* speaks of how the *gopis* left everything behind, drawn only by His call - just as the sheep respond only to the voice of the Good Shepherd. As He led the cows to graze, He also led His devotees towards spiritual fulfillment, teaching them through His actions, music and dialogue, emphasizing the importance of *dharma* (righteousness) and *bhakti* (devotion).

And, when the dark clouds gathered over *Gokul*, pouring torrents at Indra’s



command, Krishna once more showed the heart of a Shepherd. With the ease of a child at play, He lifted Govardhan Hill, and held it aloft as a shield for His people and their cattle. Beneath its vast shelter, fear gave way to faith as the flock rested secure. This *leela* reveals not merely divine power, but divine care : the Shepherd places Himself between the storm and His children, bearing the burden upon His own shoulders, so that none are lost. In lifting the hill, He lifted also the hearts of His people, teaching that true love protects, sustains, and carries the weight of the flock.

Though Lord Krishna Himself is not recorded as cooking for others in the *Puranic* texts, yet His providence ensured that none who turned to Him in faith were left uncared



for. The Lord, Who is the eternal sustainer, need not always stir the pot or kindle the fire with His own hands; His divine will is enough to provide abundance where want prevails. And so, it was during the Pandavas' exile in the forest, when sustenance was scarce, and hunger shadowed every day. To protect them, the Sun God bestowed upon Yudhishtir the divine *Akshaya Patra* - a vessel that would provide limitless food until the family had eaten for the day. Day after day Draupadi used it with devotion, feeding all who came, until one day the mighty sage Durvas and his disciples arrived after the vessel had been emptied. Faced with the impossible, Draupadi turned her heart to Krishna in desperate prayer. By His *leela*, a single grain remaining in the vessel became the source of inexhaustible satisfaction, and the revered guests were fed without want. In that sacred act of provision, Krishna's loving guidance was revealed : though He did not cook with His own hands, He orchestrated the miracle, ensuring that the flock under His care - the Pandavas, Draupadi and their visitors - were nourished and sustained. Krishna's providential role here aligns perfectly with Jesus feeding the multitudes, and Sai Baba serving His devotees, highlighting the shepherdly essence : guiding, protecting and sustaining His flock. Thus, Krishna too stands before us as the Good Shepherd, tenderly providing, foreseeing needs, and protecting His children from the pangs of hunger. Just as a shepherd tends to his flock, protecting them from danger, and leading them to safety, so too did Krishna seek to guide His

followers, offering them the solace of divine love and forgiveness. His compassionate words and miraculous healings provided spiritual sustenance, much like a shepherd who ensures the well-being of his sheep in every way.

In *Advaita*, the individual soul (*jeev*) is lost in the forest of ignorance (*avidya*), forgetful of its divine source. The Good Shepherd - be it Christ, Krishna or Sai - acts as the revealer of truth, leading the soul back to its true identity in *Brahman*, the Supreme Self. "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30) is a profoundly *Vedantic* statement, pointing to non-dual unity between the manifest and the eternal.

In the Gospel narratives, the figure of Jesus emerges as one who both commands the forces of nature, and nourishes the deepest needs of humanity, weaving divine authority with boundless compassion. Once, when a furious storm swept across the sea of Galilee, the disciples cried out in fear, certain their boat would sink. But, Jesus, their Master, arose from His repose with calm authority, rebuked the winds and the waves, and the waters stilled at His word.

The same Shepherd who protects His flock from the storm also nourishes them in the wilderness. On one occasion, five thousand hungry men, besides women and children, sat before Him, and with just five loaves and two fishes, He blessed, and broke the bread until all were fed and satisfied.

Again, on another day, four thousand gathered with Him in a deserted place, faint with hunger. Seven loaves and a few small fishes became, in His hands, a banquet that left none empty. In each act - stilling the tempest, feeding the multitudes - Jesus revealed the Shepherd's heart : guarding His sheep from peril, and sustaining them with providence, so that not one soul entrusted to Him would be abandoned. Thus, the Good Shepherd walks with His flock, turning fear into peace, and hunger into abundance.


Among the many titles Jesus of Nazareth used to describe himself, one glows with an unmistakable warmth : "The Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep... I know my own and my own know me... and there shall be one flock, one shepherd."

Far to the east, in the humble village of Shirdi, Shirdi Sai Baba took on a similar role, though with a unique emphasis on service to the underprivileged and the downtrodden. Sai Baba's 'flock' was not limited to any specific religious or cultural group. His kindness extended equally to Hindus, Muslims and all those in need of solace. In a metaphorical sense, the goats that Sai Baba tended to represent those who were often neglected or marginalized in society. Just as the goat is often seen as a humble animal, symbolic of sacrifice and submission, Sai Baba embodied these qualities, offering comfort and guidance to those who sought Him out, irrespective of their social standing or background. His acts of selfless service, His healing touch and His unifying presence continue to inspire millions around the world.

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, protects His flock to the point of laying down His life. Sai Baba too bore the sufferings of His devotees, taking on their *karmic* burdens. Many *leelas* (miraculous episodes) describe how Baba absorbed illnesses or dangers that were meant for His followers. His simple life at Dwarkamai was a life of constant vigil - like the shepherd who stays awake while the flock sleeps. Just as Jesus sacrificed for humanity, Baba too lived for others, often going without food or rest to protect and heal.

In the parable of the lost sheep (Luke 15:4-7), Jesus speaks of the shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine to find the one who is lost. Similarly, Sai Baba's grace reached those who were forgotten by society. As He said, "No one who comes to my feet will ever be turned away."

This inclusivity and divine outreach



is the hallmark of both Jesus and Baba - seekers or strays, all are embraced.


Sai Baba was ever the Shepherd of Shirdi - watchful, unbidden, yet ever present when His flock trembled. Once, when a storm raged over the village, blackening

the skies and driving men and beasts to panic, the people ran not to the old shrines, but to the *Masjid*, crying only His name. Baba stepped forth, faced the tempest with calm command, and at His word the winds hushed, the clouds broke, and the night was restored to peace.

On another day, when the *dhuni* flared dangerously high, threatening the very roof of His abode, Baba struck the pillar with His *satka*, and rebuked the flames as one would a restless child. Instantly they obeyed, subsiding into a gentle glow. Whether storm above or fire within, nature itself bent to His voice, for in Shirdi the Shepherd's care embraced not only men, but the elements themselves, lest harm befall His flock.


In Shirdi's humble Dwarkamai, Sai Baba lit the fire, cooked the food, and served it with His own hands to those who came hungry and weary. In that tender act, the *Fakir* of Shirdi revealed Himself as the Good Shepherd - one who not only watches over His flock, but feeds them with His own love, making their hunger His concern. Each morsel He served became a token of divine care, assuring His devotees that the





Shepherd's duty is not only to guide, but also to nourish, not only to teach, but also to sustain.

The healing power of Jesus Christ



transcends time, reaching from ancient biblical accounts to countless testimonies today. His promise - "I am with you always" wasn't limited to His disciples, but extends to believers everywhere who seek His divine intervention.

These modern miracles happen through prayer, faith gatherings and quiet moments of desperate belief.

Through testimonies shared across communities and social media, we see evidence that Jesus's healing ministry didn't end with His ascension. It continues unabated, offering hope to those facing physical, emotional and spiritual afflictions in our broken world. His grace flows quietly through prayer, surges in the fellowship of faith, and shines in countless testimonies of lives renewed beyond human explanation.

In the same stream of compassion, Shirdi Sai Baba blessed His devotees with remedies that healed body and soul alike -





sometimes with the mere glance of His eyes, at times through the sacred ash of *Udi*, and always through His presence that removed the deepest afflictions of the heart.

And, long before, Lord Krishna bent low to wash the weary feet of His friend Sudama, teaching us that the touch of the Divine is not lofty and distant, but tender and near. In the dust of friendship He revealed the fragrance of eternity, where love outweighs grandeur. The Shepherd of *Gokul* showed that divinity stoops not in weakness, but in strength, to lift the humble heart. And, in such gestures, heaven itself bends towards earth in quiet majesty.

Far back in time, before the Shepherds of Galilee and Shirdi walked the earth, the meadows of Vrindavan echoed with the



lilting notes of a divine flute. At their sound, calves paused mid-step, cows looked up



with love-filled eyes, and *gopas* and *gopis* left all tasks behind - for it was Krishna, the cowherd boy, who called them.

And, like Sai Baba, Krishna knew each soul intimately. When the *gopis*, lost in separation, cried out in longing, Krishna appeared in many forms at once - one for each heart.

So also, when Arjun trembled in confusion on the battlefield, it was the same Krishna, the Shepherd of *Dharma*, Who guided him with the immortal wisdom of the Bhagvad Geeta. In that moment, He held not just a chariot's reins, but the reins of Arjun's soul.

Despite their differing traditions, Krishna, Jesus and Sai Baba share a deep, abiding connection in their role as the Good Shepherds. Their lives were not merely about physical sustenance for the body, but spiritual nourishment for the soul. Each, in His own way, demonstrated the qualities of a true shepherd - compassion, selflessness and the commitment to guide their flock towards higher spiritual consciousness.

The environments in which these Shepherds worked - the verdant fields of Vrindavan, the sun-baked roads of Galilee and the sacred lanes of Shirdi - serve as poignant symbols of the various paths through which divine care and guidance manifest. Whether it was the lush greenery of Vrindavan, the dust of Galilean roads or the tranquil village of Shirdi, each locale

reflected the contextual needs of their time and the unique ways in which these Spiritual Leaders served the communities.

Across the ages, these Holy Manifestations reveal one truth : God's love is healing love. Whether in Christ's enduring touch, Baba's all-embracing mercy or Krishna's humble service, the Divine bends towards the suffering with infinite care. Like the Good Shepherd Who knows each sheep by name, they guide the lost, shelter the weak, and carry the broken upon their shoulders. Their staff is protection, their call is love, and their pasture is the peace of the soul. To remember this is to live in hope - that no affliction, no sorrow, no wound is too deep for the gentle balm of God's grace :

Shepherds of souls, with tender hands they guide,

In pastures of grace, their flocks safely abide.

Storms turn to stillness, hunger fades away,

Their love lights the path, like dawn's gentle ray.



संसार को सुख और आनंद देने वाले, हे सच्चिदानंद सद्गुरु साईनाथ, तुम्हारी जय हो! भक्तों के प्रणतपाल हे साई दयाल, तुम्हारी जय हो! संकटमोचन, हे भक्त मनमोहन, तुम्हारी जय हो! भवसागर के तारणहार, हे करुणाकर साई, तुम्हारी जय हो! हम सभी भक्तजन तुम्हें साष्टांग प्रणाम करते हैं।

अहा! तुम्हारी उस अद्भुत, आनंदमयी, दिव्य हांडी का तो कहना ही क्या! उसमें तुम्हारे हाथों से पका भोजन-प्रसाद जन-जन की आत्मा की क्षुधा शांत करता था। इसके लिए तुम स्वयं कितनी मेहनत-मशक्कत करते थे। एक माँ के सिवाय कौन करेगा इतना? महापुरुषों और अवतारों की परंपरा में बिरला ही कोई संत हुआ होगा, या कहूँ कि शायद ही कभी ईश्वर ने मनुष्य रूप में आकर भट्टी सुलगाई हों, अपने हाथों से दाल-मसाले पीसे हों और भोजन पका कर अपने भूखे-प्यासे भक्तों

को तृप्त किया हो! तुमने किया, दीनदयाल, अन्नदान का वह महायज्ञ तुमने किया। तैत्तिरीय उपनिषद में कहा है कि अन्न ही ब्रह्म है। उसी से सब जीवों की उत्पत्ति होती है, पालन होता है और अंत में सब उसी में लय हो जाते हैं। अन्न ही जीवन का आधार है। इसलिए अन्न ही महादान है, इससे बड़ा और कोई दान नहीं। जैसे भक्ति के बिना भजन व्यर्थ है, वैसे ही अन्नदान बिना किसी भी दान-पुण्य का कोई अर्थ नहीं, वह अपूर्ण है। तुमने इस वेद-वचन को अपनी लीला से चरितार्थ कर दिखाया।

कितने भाग्यशाली होंगे वे भक्त जिन्होंने अपनी आँखों से तुम्हारी वह सुभग लीला देखी! तुम मसजिद के आँगन में भट्टी लगा रहे हो! भट्टी में लकड़ियाँ डाल रहे हो! अग्नि प्रज्वलित हो रही है। वह थोड़ी भी मंद पड़ती है तो तुम अपनी साँसों की फूँक मार कर उसे फिर प्रज्वलित कर देते हो! तुम्हारे भक्त हाथ बाँधे तुम्हारे पास



ही खड़े हैं। वे तुम्हारी मदद भी करना चाहते हैं; पर तुम किसी से मदद लेना ही नहीं चाहते। फिर वे बेचारे क्या करते! विवश होकर तुम्हें पसीना बहाते हुए देखते रहते हैं। छोटे-से छोटा काम भी तुम खुद ही करते थे, यहाँ तक कि अपनी कफ़नी और लंगोट भी तुम अपने हाथों से ही सिलते थे। किसी से किंचित भी मदद की आशा नहीं रखते थे। तुम्हारी अनुमति के बिना किसी की क्या मजाल कि वह आगे बढ़ कर तुम्हारी मदद करने का दुस्साहस कर सके। भोजन पकाने का भी हर काम तुम खुद ही करते थे। मसजिद का फ़र्श गोबर से लीपते। भट्टी सुलगाते। कुएं से पानी खींचते। हांडी में पानी भरते। हांडी भट्टी पर चढ़ाते। कभी ज्वारी, तो कभी दूसरा अन्न पकाने के लिए हांडी में डालते। खुद ही बाज़ार से नगद दाम देकर दाल, मसाले आदि खरीद कर लाते थे। खुद ही सिल पर उन्हें पीसते थे। गाँव की स्त्रियाँ मदद करना चाहतीं, तो तुम उन्हें भी मना कर देते थे। कहते, “राहू दे! तुम्ही स्वतःला मदत करा! तेवढे पुरेसे आहे. माझी कर्म माझ्यासोबत! तुमची कर्म तुमच्यासोबत!” (“रहने दो! खुद की मदद करो! वह ही काफ़ी है। मेरे कर्म मेरे साथ! तुम्हारे कर्म तुम्हारे साथ!”)

हांडी के खौलते पानी में कलछुल या चमचा नहीं, बल्कि तुम अपना हाथ डाल कर पकते अन्न को हिलाते-डुलाते थे। लोग अचरज से देखते कि हांडी के खौलते-उबलते पानी से तुम्हारे हाथ पर न फफोले पड़ते, न जलन का कोई निशान दिखता था। क्या किसी साधारण मनुष्य के लिए यह संभव है कि वह आग की ज्वाला को पकड़े और हाथ भी न जले! हांडी में भोजन पकने के बाद तुम मौलवी को बुला कर इस्लामी रीति-रिवाज के साथ फ़ातिहा पढ़वाते थे। हालाँकि इसकी ज़रूरत नहीं थी। तुम्हारे हाथों के स्पर्श से ही भोजन स्वयं ही पवित्र हो जाता था; किसी मंत्र या फ़ातिहा से उसे पवित्र करने की आवश्यकता ही कहाँ थी! लेकिन, तुम तो लोकाचार निभाना चाहते थे। हिंदू-मुस्लिम मेल-भाव की ऐसी मिसाल भला और कहाँ मिलेगी! तुम्हारे अलावा ऐसा कर भी कौन सकता था! फिर भी दुनिया वालों ने तुमसे कुछ नहीं सीखा। किया यह कि मज़हबी झगड़े-टंटे खड़े किए। मंदिर में नमाज़ या मसजिद में देव-मूर्ति दिख जाए, तो हंगामा खड़ा हो जाता है, दंगे-फ़साद होने लगते हैं। तुम्हारे इसी तरह के आचार-व्यवहार के कारण कुछ लोग तुम्हें सनातन विरोधी और मुस्लिम तक करार देते हैं। मैं उनसे पूछता हूँ, क्या इस्लाम में रामनवमी होती है?

गोपाल काला (कृष्ण जन्माष्टमी) होता है? तुम (बाबा) तो यह सब मानते थे, हिंदू देवी-देवताओं को मानते थे। अपनी दक्षिणा के धन से तुमने कितने ही देवी-देवताओं के टूटे-फूटे मंदिरों का जीर्णोद्धार किया था! तुम्हारी मसजिदमाई में धूनी, पूजा-आरती, अग्निहोत्र होते थे। घंटे-घड़ियाल बजते थे। शंखनाद होता था। भजन-कीर्तन होते थे। क्या यह सब इस्लाम के निशान हैं! तुम्हें याद है न, बाबा! भगवान् दत्तात्रेय की उपेक्षा के अपराध में तुमने नानासाहेब चाँदोरकर को कितना डाँटा था! उन्हें फटकारते हुए कहा था, “नाना! तू एवढा प्रदीर्घ काळ माझ्यासोबत आहेस; तरीदेखील असे आचरण तुझ्याकडून कसे घडले? तुझे मन का गोंधळले?” (“नाना! तुम इतने समय से मेरे सान्निध्य में हो; फिर भी तुमने कुछ भी नहीं सीखा। तुम्हारी बुद्धि भ्रमित कैसे हुई?”) नानासाहेब को तुम्हारे इन शब्दों का अर्थ समझ में नहीं आया। वे तो अपने साढ़ू भाई बिनीवाले के साथ जल्दी से जल्दी तुम्हारा दर्शन करने के लिए कोपरगाँव से लगभग भागते हुए शिर्डी आए थे; फिर क्यों तुम उन्हें डाँट रहे थे? उन्होंने तुमसे क्या नहीं सीखा? बहुत सोचने के बाद भी उनकी समझ में कुछ नहीं आया, तो उन्होंने तुम्हारे चरण पकड़ लिए और पूछा, “बाबा! माझ्याकडून काय चूक झाली?” (“बाबा! मुझसे क्या भूल हो गई?”) तुमने फिर पूछते हुए कहा, “तुम्ही कोपरगावहून थेट इथे का आला?” (“तुम कोपरगाँव से सीधे यहाँ क्यों आए?”)

अब नाना की समझ में आया कि उनसे क्या भूल हुई थी। कोपरगाँव से शिर्डी के रास्ते में भगवान् दत्तात्रेय का मंदिर पड़ता था। वे जब भी कल्याण से शिर्डी आते, तो बीच में कोपरगाँव रुक कर पहले भगवान् दत्तात्रेय का दर्शन करते थे; फिर शिर्डी की ओर क़दम बढ़ाते थे। उस दिन उन्होंने जल्दी से जल्दी तुम्हारा (बाबा का) दर्शन करने की उतावली में दत्त देव की उपेक्षा कर दी। वे कोपरगाँव का दत्त मंदिर छोड़ कर ताँगे से सीधे शिर्डी चले आए। उनके साढ़ू भाई बिनीवाले विशेष रूप से दत्तात्रेय के परम भक्त थे और शिर्डी जाने से पहले कोपरगाँव के मंदिर में उनका दर्शन करना चाहते थे। उस दिन नाना ने उनकी भावना की परवाह न की। बस, यही उनकी भारी भूल थी। तुम (बाबा) नहीं चाहते थे कि तुम्हारा कोई भक्त किसी देव-देवता की उपेक्षा करके तुम्हारा दर्शन करने आए। किंतु, नाना ने यह नहीं पूछा कि तुम्हें कैसे पता चला कि वे दत्त मंदिर की उपेक्षा करके शिर्डी आए थे। पूछने की

ज़रूरत भी नहीं थी। नानासाहेब अनेक वर्षों से तुम्हारे साथ थे। वे जानते थे कि तुम सब जानते हो! तुम अंतर्दामी हो! सर्वव्यापी हो! तुमसे कुछ भी छुपा नहीं। तुम्हारे आगे छल, कपट, झूठ, फरेब, दुराव, छुपाव की कोई चाल चलने वाली नहीं। भलाई इसी में है कि समर्पण कर दो। नानासाहेब ने भी वही करना श्रेयस्कर समझा। हाथ जोड़ कर बोले, “बाबा! गोदावरी में स्नान करते समय मेरे पैर में काँटा चुभ गया था। बहुत कष्ट हुआ।” तुमने उन्हें चेतावनी देते हुए कहा, “ही तर छोटीशीच शिक्षा होती। यापुढे कायम सावधान असावे. जो भगवान दत्तात्रेयांकडे दुर्लक्ष करून मला भेटायला येतो, त्याच्यावर मी कसा प्रसन्न होणार!” (“अब से सदैव सावधान रहना। वह



काँटा तो एक छोटा-सा दंड था। जो भगवान् दत्तात्रेय की उपेक्षा करके मेरा दर्शन करने आयेगा, क्या मैं उस अभागे से प्रसन्न होऊँगा?’)

साईनाथ! देवी-देवताओं के लिए इतना श्रद्धा भाव और सम्मान था तुम्हारे हृदय में। तो फिर कौन हो तुम? हिंदू या मुसलमान? बताओ न, बाबा! बोलो, न!... क्या कहा?... अल्लाह मालिक... सबका मालिक एक... बस, तुम्हारी यह गोलमोल उलटबाँसी ही तो हमें भ्रम में डाल देती है। तुम समझाना कुछ चाहते हो और हम समझते कुछ और हैं। अब, मैं कैसे समझाऊँ, किस-किस को समझाऊँ, साईनाथ? किंतु... किंतु तुमने कहा है, विवाद में मत पड़ो। कोई तुम्हें (बाबा को) कुछ भी कहे, उसे कहने दो। ठीक है, दयानाथ! मैं ही मौन हो जाता हूँ।

हाँ, तो मैं तुम्हारी हांडी की चर्चा कर रहा था। हांडी का प्रसाद सबसे पहले तुम म्हालसापति और तात्या को भिजवाते थे। फिर, प्रसाद पाने के इच्छुक अन्य भक्तों को पंगतों में बिठा कर अपने हाथ से प्रेम पूर्वक उनके आगे भोजन परोसते थे। वे खाकर तृप्त होते थे। तुम उन्हें खिला कर तुष्ट होते थे। भोजन परोसते हुए तुम प्रेम से कहते, “घ्या, घ्या! आणखी थोडे घ्या! असे स्वादिष्ट, पोषक अन्न पुन्हा लाभेल याची आशा धरू नका. हे भोजन मनसोक्त ग्रहण करा! तृप्त व्हा!” (“लो, लो! थोड़ा और लो! ऐसा स्वादिष्ट, पोषक अन्न फिर मिलने की उम्मीद मत करना। यह भोजन यथेष्ट ग्रहण करो! तृप्त हो जाओ!”)

शाकाहारी और मांसाहारी भक्तों की पंक्तियाँ अलग-अलग होती थीं। तुमने कभी किसी शाकाहारी के सामने मांसाहार नहीं परोसा, न खाने दिया। अलबत्ता कभी-कभी तुम अपने भक्तों की परीक्षा अवश्य लेते थे। सुनाऊँ वह कथा?

दादा केलकर कर्मकांडी ब्राह्मण थे और तुम्हारे कट्टर भक्त भी। उन्होंने अपना तन, मन, वचन और कर्म अपने गुरु, अर्थात् तुम्हें (बाबा को) समर्पित किया हुआ था। गुरु का आदेश पालन ही उनके लिए सबसे बड़ा धर्म था। यह जानने के लिए कि वे अपने धर्म में कितने दृढ़ हैं, एक एकादशी के दिन तुमने उन्हें बाज़ार से मांस खरीद कर लाने का आदेश दिया। आश्चर्य! कट्टर ब्राह्मण दादा केलकर तनिक भी नहीं झिझके। एक क्षण के लिए भी नहीं सोचा कि वे कौन-सा धर्म निभाएँ? ब्राह्मण का या




शिष्य का? वे कट्टर ब्राह्मण थे, तो तुम्हारे कट्टर भक्त! उनके लिए तो गुरु का आदेश पालन ही सबसे बड़ा धर्म था। वे तुरंत मांस खरीदने बाज़ार जाने के लिए तैयार हो गए। तभी तुमने उन्हें रोक कर कहा, “राहू दे, गणेश! दुसऱ्याला पाठव!” (“रहने दो गणेश (दादा केलकर का असली नाम)! किसी दूसरे को भेज दो!”) केवल धन, वस्त्र, वस्तु आदि अर्पण करना गुरु दक्षिणा नहीं, गुरु के आदेश का पालन करना भी गुरु दक्षिणा है। दादा केलकर गुरु भक्ति की इस परीक्षा में उत्तीर्ण हो गए थे। अब उन्हें बाज़ार जाने की आवश्यकता ही कहाँ रही थी! जय हो, साईनाथ! तुम धन्य हो! तुमने दादा केलकर की परीक्षा भी ले ली और उनका अपना सहज धर्म भी कायम रखा।

तुम्हारी हांडी का कार्यक्रम सन उन्नीस सौ दस तक ऐसे ही चलता रहा। इसके बाद दासगणु महाराज के भजन-कीर्तन के प्रभाव से तुम्हारा यश ऐसा फैला कि मुंबई और दूरदराज़ के गाँव-शहरों से भक्तों के झुंड तुम्हारे दर्शनार्थ शिर्डी आने लगे। वे आते, तो अपने साथ भारी मात्रा में फल, मिष्ठान्न और तरह-तरह के पकवान तुम्हारे लिए नैवेद्य लेकर आते थे, जो भक्तों, भिक्षुकों और फ़कीरों को खिलाने के बाद भी बहुत-सा बच जाता

था। इसलिए अब हांडी चढ़ाने की कोई आवश्यकता न रही। हांडी के बिना भी भंडारा चलता रहा; बल्कि पहले से अधिक ज़ोर-शोर से चलने लगा। पहले से अधिक प्रकार के स्वादिष्ट व्यंजनों से भक्तों की क्षुधा तृप्त होती रही। धन्य थे वे बड़भागी, जिन्होंने तुम्हारे (बाबा के) हाथों से परोसे दिव्य भंडारे के स्वादिष्ट व्यंजनों के सुस्वाद का भरपूर आनंद लिया। हम अभागे तो बस् उस आनंद की कल्पना मात्र श्री साई सत् चरित से कर सकते हैं। अब कहाँ मिलेगी वह आमटी, जो तुम हांडी में अपने हाथों से पकाते थे! कहाँ मिलेंगे वे मुटकुले, जो प्रेम से अपने भक्तों को तुम खिलाते थे!

वह छाछ! तुम्हारे हाथों से बनी वह अमृतमयी छाछ, जो तुमने अन्य भक्तों के साथ अपने अनन्य भक्त, गोविंदराव दाभोलकर जी को पिलाई, वह स्वादिष्ट छाछ हमें अब पीने को कहाँ मिलेगी? अहा! वह दिव्य छाछ, जिसे पीकर गोविंदराव हेमाडपंत हो गए, जिसे मथ कर हमें साईलीलामृत दे गए। हम तो, बस्, अब उसी लीलामृत की अमृतमयी छाछ पी सकते हैं, पी रहे हैं, पीते रहेंगे, पी-पी कर भी न थकेंगे!

साई बाबा की लीलाएँ...

उपरोक्त तथ्यों से महाराज की दिव्यता पर विश्वास होता है और प्रत्यक्ष दर्शन एवं सहवास से यह विश्वास और भी दृढ़ हो जाता है। तथा यह विश्वास हो जाता है कि महाराज ही सद्गुरु हैं और उनके प्रति पूर्ण समर्पण ही मोक्ष का मार्ग है। मन के इस दृढ़ निश्चय से यह निश्चित हो जाता है कि हमारे शास्त्रों में वर्णित संतों और आध्यात्मिक गुरुओं के लक्षण सब महाराज के लक्षणों के अनुरूप ही हैं।

महाराज के गुणों या उनकी लीलाओं का सटीक वर्णन करना असंभव है; लेकिन मुझे लगता है कि कुछ मार्गदर्शन देना वांछनीय होगा। ऐसा करने का सबसे अच्छा तरीका यह है कि मैं यहाँ उन अनगिनत अनुभवों का उल्लेख करूँ जो मुझे या मेरी जानकारी में अन्य लोगों को हुए हैं। मैं उनका वर्णन यहाँ कर रहा हूँ।

बहुत बड़ा भक्त था। एक दिन वह महाराज की तस्वीर के पास वाली दीवार पर त्रिशूल खींच रहा था। यह देख कर मैंने उससे पूछा, “तुम यह क्यों बनवा रहे हो?”

मेघा ने कहा, “मैं आज सुबह जल्दी उठा। मैं बिस्तर पर ही लेटा था। उस समय, मुझे लगा कि मैंने महाराज की आवाज़ सुनी है और जो शब्द मैंने सुने, वे थे, ‘मेघा, त्रिशूल लगाओ!’ उस समय, मैंने देखा कि बाबा (महाराज को ज़्यादातर लोग ‘बाबा’ कहते हैं।) वहाँ नहीं हैं और हमारे वाड़े के दोनों तरफ़ के दरवाज़े बंद थे; लेकिन वह आवाज़ बाबा की ही थी और कुछ अक्षत बिस्तर पर पड़े हुए थे। मैं तुरंत उठा, मस्जिद में बाबा के पास गया और पूछा, ‘बाबा, क्या आप त्रिशूल निकालना चाहते हैं?’ बाबा ने कहा, ‘हाँ।’ इसलिए मैं यह त्रिशूल निकाल रहा हूँ।”

यह कहने के बाद, अगली सुबह लगभग दस बजे मेघा बाबा के पास गया और बाबा ने उसे एक शिवलिंग दिया; किसी ने इसे उसी समय बाबा के हाथ में लाकर दिया था। बाबा ने कहा, “मेघा, इसे ले जाओ और इसकी पूजा करो!”

मेघा शिवलिंग लेकर घर आया और मुझे दिखाते हुए बोला, “देखो, बाबा ने मुझे पूजा करने के लिए एक शिवलिंग दिया है।” उस समय उसके चेहरे पर अपार प्रसन्नता थी। उस प्रसन्नता का विशेष महत्व समझने के लिए, उसका थोड़ा इतिहास बताना ज़रूरी है।

यह मेघा खेड़ा ज़िले में डिप्टी कलेक्टर रावबहादुर हरि विनायक साठे का सेवक था। उसे गायत्री मंत्र भी नहीं आता था। वह उसे रावबहादुर साठे ने सिखाया। कुछ दिनों बाद, साठे ने उसे शिव मंदिर में पूजा के लिए रखा। उसके बाद, साठे बाबा के पास गए और उनकी श्रद्धा श्री बाबा के चरणों में दृढ़ हो गई। उन्होंने बाबा के दर्शन के लिए आने वाले लोगों की सुविधा के लिए शिर्डी में एक वाड़ा भी बनवाया। साठे चाहते थे कि मेघा को बाबा की सेवा के लिए शिर्डी में रखा जाए। साठे ने उसे ऐसा बताया। यह सुन कर मेघा दुखी हो गया। उसने सुना था कि महाराज एक मुसलमान है और शंकर की पूजा करने के बजाय मुसलमान की सेवा के लिए मालिक उनके पास भेज रहे हैं, यही उसकी उदासी का कारण बना। साठे ने उसे समझाया और महाराज के वास्तविक स्वरूप से थोड़ा परिचित कराया। उसका दुख कुछ हद तक कम हुआ, लेकिन दूर नहीं हुआ। फिर वह शिर्डी चला गया। जैसे ही

उसने मस्जिद के आँगण में पैर रखा, महाराज उठ खड़े हुए और बोले, “ऊपर मत आओ! सावधान रहो! तुम एक मुसलमान के पास क्यों आए हो?”

महाराज का क्रोध, जो ऊपरी तौर पर और सिर्फ पहचान के लिए था, तुरंत शांत हो गया। मेघा कुछ दिन शिर्डी में रुका और फिर अपने घर लौट गया। लेकिन, वहाँ महाराज के प्रति उसका इतना लगाव हो गया कि वह शीघ्र ही शिर्डी लौट गया और वहीं रहने लगा। वह बाबा को शंकर मानता था और सदैव “शंकर... शंकर” कहता था और जब भी वह बाबा का उल्लेख करना चाहता, तो ‘शंकर’ नाम का ही प्रयोग करता था। बाद में, बाबा की एक बड़ी तसवीर लाकर साठे वाड़े में रख दी गई। तब से, वह उस तसवीर को शंकर मान कर उसकी पूजा करता रहा। उसके लगभग एक वर्ष बाद, उपर्युक्त घटना घटी। जिस दिन शिवलिंग महाराज के हाथों में आना था, उससे एक दिन पहले मेघा को त्रिशूल बनाने का आदेश दिया गया और वह भी महाराज प्रत्यक्ष नहीं दिखाई देते हुए भी! लेकिन, उनकी वाणी सुनाई दी। यह चमत्कार निश्चित रूप से उत्सुकता भरा है ही; परंतु ध्यान रखने योग्य एक और बात यह है कि महाराज ने उसे उसकी वह पूजा जारी रखने के लिए प्रेरित किया। जैसा कि महाराज की आरती में कहा है, जैसी मन की भावना, वैसा ही अनुभव, देते हैं तुम दयाघन! यह तुम्हारी लीला है। इस प्रकार भक्तों के अनुभवों द्वारा ऐसा हमेशा प्रतीत होता है।

Divine Experiences of Sai Maharaj

The Sacred *Udi* of Shree Sai Baba

Almost 15 years have passed, an incident unfolded that devotees of Sai Baba still recall as a shining example of the power of faith and the unseen protection of the *Guru*.

Bapusaheb Jog remembered Baba speaking one day at the

mosque...

“*Kaka* (late Bhausahab Dixit) is very ill with fever. He will not take medicine without me. I have to go to Parle. But, you call him here!”

It was the fifth day of Bhausahab’s high fever. True to his unwavering devotion, he had refused any medicine, relying only on Baba’s

sacred *Udi* (sacred ash) and *Tirtha* (holy water).

When a message reached through Bapusaheb, Bhausahab immediately resolved to leave for Shirdi the next evening. He sent a message to me to take him from Parle to Shirdi so that his wife would not worry.

As preparations for departure began, a subtle worry about Bhausahab's condition arose afresh. On visiting his bungalow, it was clear that his health was still frail. A wise decision was made by Baba : Bhausahab, his wife, the family cook woman would travel together to

Shirdi.

The journey itself soon proved why this arrangement was providential. At Manmad station, a tense moment occurred when some foreign soldiers attempted to barge inside the women's compartment where only the two ladies (aforementioned) sat.

Just imagine, if Bhausahab been alone in the train with his frail health condition, the situation could have turned ugly and dangerous... We reached Shirdi without any further incident.

Most remarkably, the fever that had plagued Bhausahab in Parle for days, subsided like a miracle once he set foot in Shirdi - and never returned...

To Bhausahab's companions and Baba's disciples, it was clear : Faith in the *Guru* had not only brought healing, but also shielded them from unseen dangers lurking along the way.

This small episode illustrates a big and timeless truth : when faith is complete, even in the darkest uncertainty, wisdom and strength arise through the grace of the *Guru*.

For while many call themselves teachers, only the rarest *Guru* lightens the burden of suffering for his followers.

To find such a true *Guru* is exceedingly rare - and in Sai Baba, the devotees found one who guided them through illness, danger and doubt, with love beyond measure.

The response was nothing short of miraculous. Within two hours, the raging fever began to subside. By nightfall, the child stirred, and slowly regained consciousness.

When the family departed safely for their native Daryapur, their gratitude overflowed. They handed over me five rupees to offer to Baba's Permanent Fund. The amount has been sent to you by money order to be deposited in the permanent fund.

How a Painful Boil Vanished Without Surgery...

Among the countless stories of Sai Baba's divine grace, some shine through their sheer simplicity - reminding us that where human effort fails, faith in the *Guru* prevails.

One such incident occurred within my own family, when my younger brother suffered from a stubborn boil on his hand.

It began in the village, where his hand grew swollen and painful. He tried local remedies, but none worked. Later, when he came to stay with us in Andheri, I took him to doctors.

They examined him carefully and declared that only an operation could help. The very thought of surgery filled us with fear. Meanwhile, my brother's suffering worsened.

At that moment, Baba's *Udi* came to mind. Encouraged by my elder brother, I mixed *Udi* in water, and applied it to the boil that night.

Strangely, after doing so, the hand trembled, and brother could not sleep all night. By morning, there was

still no sign of the boil breaking. My elder brother then suggested we give it one more try.

"Apply the *Udi* again," he said, "and if it does not break within a few hours, we will take him to the doctor."

There was no sign of change. My elder brother finally told the patient, "Wash your hands, and go to the doctor."

But, just as he began washing his hands, the miracle occurred! The boil suddenly burst on its own, the pain subsided, and within a few days he was completely healed - without the need for a complicated surgery.

This incident once again proved the power of Baba's *Udi*. It was not medicine, not the doctor's knife, but the blessing of the *Sadguru* that brought relief.

Truly, *Udi* is not mere ash - it is Baba's grace in tangible form, curing both the body and the spirit.

Mitral Valve Repair Surgery Camp Successful at Shree Sai Baba Hospital...

The Mitral Valve Repair Surgery Camp organized at the Shree Sai Baba Super Specialty Hospital, of Shree Saibaba Sansthan Trust, Shirdi, on October 13 and 24, 2025, was successfully conducted. During this camp, very complex, but successful heart surgeries were performed

for free on 7 patients.

Such surgeries cost lakhs of rupees in private hospitals. But, all these surgeries were provided completely free of cost at the Shree Sai Baba Hospital. Renowned Cardiac Surgeon Dr. Priyankar Sinha from Ahmedabad served as the lead surgeon



for this camp, and Cardiac Surgeons, Dr. Mahesh Mistry and Dr. Shreyash Potdar of Shree Sai Baba Hospital assisted.

Dr. Santosh Marathe and Dr. Vijay Kardile oversaw the work as Anesthesiologists. Shri Nadeem Ahmed and Shri Shubham Pachpind assisted as Perfusionists. The entire Cardiac Surgery Unit provided excellent support to this camp.

The camp was organized under the guidance of Shri Goraksha Gadilkar, Chief Executive Officer of the Sansthan. These surgeries worth about Rs. 35 lakhs were performed free of cost for the patients.

Relatives of the patients expressed, "Our patients got a new lease of life at this hospital run by the inspiration of Shree Sai Baba in the sacred land of Shirdi. This true service to the patients is service to God".

Brain Blood Clot Removal Surgery via Endoscopy at Shree Sai Baba Hospital...



For the first time in the Neurosurgery department at the Shree Sai Baba Hospital, of Shree Saibaba Sansthan Trust, Shirdi, a blood clot in the brain of a patient was successfully removed using Advanced Telescope (Endoscopic) technology.

After this critical surgery, the patient was brought out of the ventilator in a short time. Normally, after such brain surgery stitches patients have to be on a ventilator for 7 to 10 days; but patients get instant relief due to this method with the help of an endoscope.

The patient Shri Kisan Ananda Pawar (Age 55, resident of Hatani in taluka Umbari, Nanded district) was admitted for treatment in the Shree Sai Baba Hospital following a brain hemorrhage. After necessary investigations Dr. Santosh Unavane (Neurosurgeon) diagnosed a blood clot in the brain.

Giving information to the patient and the relatives about the surgery in detail, the

removal of the clot via Endoscopy was advised. After getting the permission this surgery was performed, and the patient is now fully well.

The benefit of special efforts of Dr. Santosh Unavane (Neurosurgeon), Dr. Nihar Joshi (Anaesthetist), as well as the entire neuro-department team, were got for the success of this surgery. This surgery was performed completely free of cost under the Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Jan Arogya Yojana. All such surgeries are done free of cost through the Government schemes in the Shree Sai Baba Hospital, appealed Dr. Santosh Unavane.


